The ITP accepts students for the fall semester of all even years (i.e. 2018, 2020, etc.). Deadline for application is March 15th every even year.</p> <p>Admission Criteria</p> <ul style="list-style-type: none"> • Overall GPA of 2.5 or higher by the end of the semester preceding application, and • ASL 106 with a grade of “Satisfactory”, and • ASL 201 and 202 with a grade of “B” or higher, and • ITP 215W and ITP 220 with a grade of “C” or higher, and • Completed the Degrees of Reading Power Language Test, and • Completed an admission interview by the ITP Interview Committee. <p>Progression and Retention in the Program</p> <ul style="list-style-type: none"> • A grade of “C” or higher is required for all ITP and lecture-based ASL courses (ASL 225, 325, 390, 425), and • A grade of “B” or higher is required (with the exception of no more than one grade of “C”) for all skill-based ASL courses (ASL 301, 302, 305, 306), and • Maintain a 2.75 GPA in the major.
